

Message from the WLCA Chairman, Cllr David Westley Dear Member

I am delighted to be contributing to my first Newsletter. This will now be sent on a seasonal basis to keep you informed of what is going on within the Association, both politically and socially. My first 6 months as Association Chairman have flown by, as it has been, a busy time due to getting up to speed with the role and the overlapping elections for the County Council, the snap General Election and then a Borough By-election in Ormskirk's Derby Ward..

The success of Cllr Eddie Pope in winning the Burscough & Rufford Division from Labour contributed to the Conservatives regaining control of Lancashire County Coun-



The snap General Election in June was certainly a surprise, Cllr Sam Currie proved to be an excellent parliamentary candidate and his campaign was considerably helped by the Party designating West Lancashire as a target seat. The help we received from the Party, both financial and organisational, coupled with some very generous donations resulted in the Association making a profit on the campaign. The result was disappointing but expected in the national context. However, the Conservative vote in West Lancashire rose by more than 4,000 or 4.5% which was quite an achievement, given Sam was only selected after the start of the Campaign and was opposing a well established sitting MP in Rosie Cooper.

Your Officers have developed a strategic plan that was approved by the Executive Council in August and are now busy with its implementation. Our aim is to increase the membership, identify good local government candidates, improve our election campaigning with the aim of regaining control of the Borough Council and building a strong base to fight the next General Election.
